Richard A. Lincoln 1925-2018

WAYNE - Richard "Rich" Arthur Lincoln, 92, passed away peacefully on Sunday, Feb. 4, 2018, at the Maine Veterans Home in Augusta following a long illness. Following are some highlights of his life. At the Knowlton Hewins Roberts website, www.khrfuneralhomes.com, you may read his full obituary that appeared in the Kennebec Journal on February

11, 2018, Richard was born June 4, 1925, at his family's home in Wayne. He attended school in Wayne and Winthrop High School, where during his senior year, Richard was drafted into the Army. Richard served as a First Scout during his Army tenure and fought in some of the most ferocious battles that occurred in the European Theater in World War II, later receiving many honors for his bravery.

In 1959 Richard married Nan DeCoster, and they recently celebrated 58 years of marriage. Together they raised two daughters and enjoyed family life in Wayne, trips to the coast and summers on Androscoggin Lake. A natural-born salesman, Richard worked for many years as a manufacturers' representative for the General Cigar and Culbro Corporations, covering the entire state of Maine, Richard was a member of the Wayne Fire Department and the Wayne Community Church where he was on the Board of Trustees for many years. He marched in an impressive 58 consecutive Memorial Day Parades.

Richard was predeceased by his parents, Vance and Jen Lincoln of Wayne; his three brothers, Vance ("Bunt"), Waldo ("Tink"), Robert ("Gib"); and a niece, Janice Lincoln. He is survived by his loving wife, Nan,; his devoted daughters Elaine and Lisa; and close family friend, Michael Garner, and sister, Helen Watson; brothers and sisters-in-law, Jack and Patricia DeCoster and Roger and Melina DeCoster; six nephews and six nieces.

A memorial service was held at the Wayne Community Church, Saturday, Feb. 24, 2018 at 1 p.m. Spring burial will be in the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Wayne.
