Town News – August 2018

The Town of Wayne is under new leadership. July 10, 2018 was the first meeting of the new Selectboard after Annual Town Meeting. We welcomed new board members Amy Black, Stan Davis and Lloyd Irland. New board members were given oaths. Also, they reorganized and elected Don Welsh as Chair and Trent Emery as Vice Chair. Congrats for a well-run meeting Don.

All unpaid **2017 Real Estate Property Taxes** will be liened on August 2, 2018. If your property has received a 30-day notice, please contact the town office to make payment arrangements.

This month the **Selectboard** will be meeting on **August 7** and **August 21 at 6:30 PM** at the **Wayne Elementary School Gymnasium**.

This month the **Planning Board** will be meeting on **Wednesday August 1st at 7:00 PM** at the **Wayne Town Office**.

The Town’s **Assessor Agent** Matt Caldwell from RJD Appraisal will be available by appointment on **Monday August 27, 2018** to answer any questions you might have about your assessment or tax bill. Please contact, the Town Office to schedule an appointment.

In observation of **Labor Day, Monday September 3, 2018**, the Town Office will be closed. It will re-open on Tuesday September 4, 2018 for regularly scheduled hours.

Your **2018 property taxes** will be committed in August and tax bills will be mailed at the end of August. **Property taxes are**

due on Monday October 1st, 2018.

Several years ago, the Town adopted a **Consumer Fireworks ban**. Please respect this ban for everyone’s safety and peaceful enjoyment of town. The Town will enforce this ban.

Please be courteous of your neighbors and drive responsibly. The Town has contracted with Kennebec County Sheriff’s Office for rural patrol this summer. Police will take notice.

The Town of Wayne has an Animal Control Ordinance that states no domesticated animal, licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted on Town property (highways, sidewalks, Ladd Recreation Center, parks, footbridge, Wayne Town House, North Wayne School House, Town Boat Launch, Fire Stations, or old Town Office) **without a leash**. The Town provides dog waste bags in the parks around the mill pond. Please be courteous of others who use these public facilities and **pickup after your dogs**.

The Town of Wayne will be conducting a **major road reconstruction and paving project** on the **Walton Road** this summer. *During the construction process, the roads will be closed to thru traffic. However, will be open for local traffic (residents, emergency vehicles, post office and school buses). You might experience temporary road closures and delays, so be prepared to stop and obey all flaggers and signs for your safety and the contractors.* Please bear with us while we work toward improving the Town roads. This will only be temporary and in the end, the Town will have smooth and safe roads to travel. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. NOTICE OF VACANCY

The Town of Wayne Board of Selectmen is actively seeking residents interested in serving their community on a Town Board or Committee. Through positive volunteerism and dedicated work, you can be the conduit that energizes your community. We want you to be a part of your Town.

The following Boards and Committees have vacancies:

Board of Appeals (2 member). The Board of Appeals shall have jurisdiction to hear and decide any appeals by any person aggrieved by any decision, order, determination, regulation, or failure to act by the Code Enforcement Officer, the Planning Board or any other board or official responsible for enforcing the Town’s land use ordinances including any codes of regulations or enforceable standards incorporated by reference into such ordinances. The Board of Appeals may grant a variance from the Town’s land-use consistent with 30-A M.R.S.A. § 4353.

Cemetery Association (1 member). The Cemetery Association meets annually to discuss the overall management care and maintenance of cemeteries.

Conservation Commission (2 members). The Conservation Commission conducts research, in conjunction with the planning board, if any, into the local land areas. They develop an index of all open areas within the municipality, whether publicly or privately owned, including open marshlands,

swamps and other wetlands, for the purpose of obtaining information relating to the proper protection, development or use of those open areas. The commission may recommend to the municipal officers or any municipal body or board, or any body politic or public agency of the State, a program for the better protection and development or use of those areas, which may include the acquisition of conservation easements.

Planning Board (1 alternate). Planning Board shall advise the Board of Selectmen and Town Manager on any matter affecting the physical development of the town; propose modifications to the Town’s Comprehensive Plan and bring such proposals to the voters; review and make recommendations to the town administration and public regarding any proposed land use ordinances; review subdivisions in accordance with laws of the State of Maine.

Solid Waste Committee (2 member). They meet quarterly to discuss the overall operation and management of the Readfield Transfer Station.

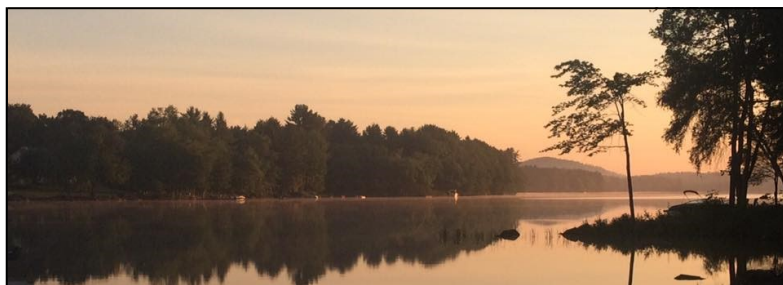

WILHELMINA (PETTENGILL) WELLS

1926-2018

WAYNE- Wilhelmina Madeline (Pettengill) Wells, 91, passed away at her house on June 30, 2018 after many years of failing health. She is now in a place where she is free of pain and never has to worry about thunderstorms again.

"Billie" was born on July 18, 1926 to William and Madeline (Steward) Pettengill in East Livermore.

Her childhood was defined by hard work, austerity and hardships which she met with tenacity and an incredibly strong will. She graduated from Livermore Falls High School and held a variety of jobs before marrying Warren Wells in 1947 and beginning their lives as dairy farmers on the Strickland Ferry Road in Wayne. She was a prolific gardener and each summer she canned, froze and preserved a whole winter's worth of fruits and vegetables. Her canned green beans were second to none. She also made sure every family member had a cake on their birthday and holidays were always celebrated with special dinners.

In later years, she began working for the United States Postal Service in Wayne. Her enjoyment and skill in being postmaster may have been partly due to her love of receiving

and sending letters. During their college years each of her granddaughters were treated at least twice a month to a handwritten letter keeping them up to date with all the comings and goings in Wayne and the activities of their Grampy and herself.

At different times in her life she was a 4-H mom, a Girl Scout Leader, a member of the Wayne Methodist Church, the Eastern Star Organization, Co-operative Extension and a bowler in the Wayne Thursday Night Bowling League. Also, daytime soap opera's "Another World" never had a more devoted fan.

She was predeceased by her parents, her husband of 55 years, brothers Frank and Richmond, and sister Fay.

She is survived by her younger sister, Sue, of Farmington; a son, Lindsay Wells, of Wayne; two daughters, Brenda Joseph and husband, George, of Fayette and Lori Carlson, of Westbrook. She also leaves behind four granddaughters, Jude Carlson-Wang, Jessica Haider, Hannah Gawrych and Lydia Aloisio, as well as six great grandchildren.

A private memorial service will be held at a later date.

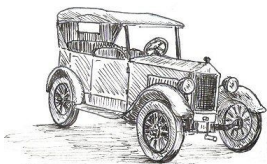

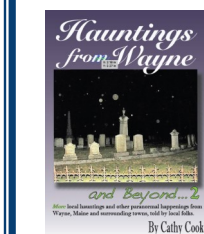

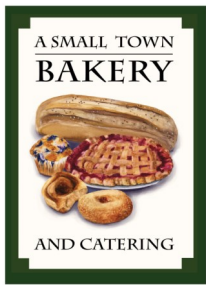
