On October 28, our District Superintendent, Rev. Rev Merriam has traveled throughout the world, with many trips devoted to mission work in Central America, Russia, Africa, the southern United States, and India, where she worked with Mother Theresa. We warmly welcome Rev. Merriam to our church during this interim period and invite you to meet her by attending worship service.

In the past months, we have been blessed with the support and guidance from the UMC New England Conference, particularly Rev. Karen Munson and Bishop Sudarshana Devadhar. Challenging times can bring out the best and worst in people, but in this period of uncertainty and change, the family of Wayne Community Church showed love and support for Pastor Jen and came together to solve problems, fill gaps, and remain faithful to the positive work the church is doing in our community and the world. During our months of navigating change together, Rev. Munson shared a quote that continues to be relevant for our journey forward.

NEWS FROM THE WAYNE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

"Open space" describes lands available for public use for activities like hiking, hunting, picnicking and biking. In 2016, Wayne voters approved a comprehensive plan that recommends retaining 15% of developable land in town (~1000 acres) for open space. The plan further advises the formation of an Open Space Committee to craft an Open Space and Recreation Plan that would guide the process of identifying and obtaining key lands. Recently, the Conservation Commission sent a letter to the Select Board in support of these voter-approved goals. The Wilson Pond/House Road town land would set Wayne well on its way of achieving the comp plan goal. The wooded lot on a hillside overlooking Wilson Pond helps protect water quality, links wildlife habitats and provides the opportunity of creating a town trail system. For more information on the comp plan please visit the Boards and Committees page of the town website. The draft report of the natural values of the Wilson Pond/House Road town land can be found on the Conservation Commission page.

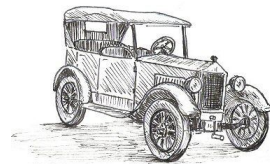
