## LOCAL EVENTS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

### MAINE'S NATIVE FISHES: AN INCOMPLETE HISTORY



In the depth of the most recent ice age, roughly 30,000 years ago, an advancing ice sheet covered much of North America and all of Maine.

Because of this, there was no suitable habitat for fish. Beginning 21,000 years ago, the ice sheet was retreating, and 11,000 years ago Maine was no longer shrouded in ice.

Dick Behr will discuss how the natural distribution of Maine's fishes evolved following the end of the last ice age.

He will highlight how humans historically altered the natural fish distribution by the construction of dams, pollution, and the introduction of non-native fish.

A portion of his presentation will focus on the current fish species present in Androscoggin Lake and how it has been altered by humans' introduction of non-native fish.

Dick Behr is a registered Maine fishing guide and Certified Maine Geologist. During the past 20 years he's also been involved with fish restoration efforts in both the Androscoggin and Kennebec Watersheds.

While he is not a fish biologist, his enthusiasm for understanding Maine's unique fisheries has enabled Dick to present this talk about Maine's native fishes.

This presentation will be 3:00 May 5<sup>th</sup> at the Williams House. There will be light refreshments at the conclusion of the talk. Androscoggin Lake Association hopes you will be able to attend.

The RSU #38 School Board met on April 10, 2018 for the final FY19 School Budget meeting. At the previous meeting the Board voted to purchase the truck and mule through a lease purchase, reducing the proposed FY19 expenditure budget by \$32,000. The Board also requested that the Administration Team (A-Team) review the proposed budget for additional cuts. The A-Team met on April 5 to discuss reductions and reluctantly agreed to recommend cutting the proposed study hall ed tech at Maranacook Community High School. This would represent a \$33,500 savings.

The following documents represent the recent two reductions totaling \$65,500.00, bringing the proposed budget increase down to a 4.11% increase over FY18 with a total FY19 budget of \$17,920,249.50: General Fund Summary Budget, Version 5 Revenue Areas, Version 5 Local Dollar Calculations, Version 5 Summary of Budget Changes 4.10.18 2018-2019 Budget Progression 4.10.18 After discussion, the RSU #38 School Board voted to adopt the proposed Version 5, RSU #38 FY19 School Budget. In addition, the Board voted to adopt the proposed FY19 Adult and Community Education Budget. The Annual Budget Meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 16, in the Maranacook Community High School gymnasium at 7:00 pm. At this meeting citizens will vote on the warrant articles of the proposed FY19 RSU #38 School Budget. Please make every effort to attend this important meeting.

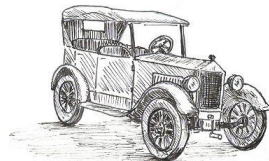

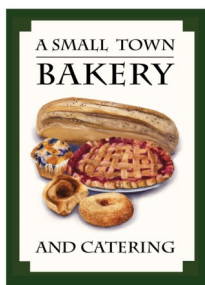
