2018 LIBRARY AUCTION: BY THE NUMBERS COMPILED BY LYNETTE STINNEFORD, LIBRARY AUCTION CHAIR

As we wrap up this years' Library Auction, here is a little recap of the things we keep track of, notice and actually count. We had 208 items donated to the auction, plus many others that went into our Buy-It-Now department. Sixty-three people made donations to the auction. The 7 member auction team contributed a total of 105 hours to set up the auction. We had at least 578 visitors and, over the course of 10 days, they placed 404 bids!!

Every year something surprises us as the "hot" item that garners the most bids, this year it was the Loon placemats with 13 bids going up 300% over its starting bid! Another little surprise was the La Creuset French Press that went up 400% over it's starting bid. And the biggest percentage increase was for the antique rotary phone that went 800% over the starting bid - with only 1 bid!! The auction raised \$6301.50, which goes into the operating budget of the library.

We appreciate all of the people who made donations, paid a visit and placed a bid. You helped make this years' auction a resounding success.
