PASTOR'S NOTE

Greetings,

I was sorting through some papers and came across a story that I hadn't read in about a year. It is out of a book called the *Unexpected Universe* and about a man called the Star Thrower. The story is written by the late Loren Eiseley. The words spoke to me, so I share them with you.

"On a beautiful tropical beach occasionally the tide and the surf would be just right, and they would combine, and cause a lot of shellfish to be cast far up onto the beach.

Some of these shellfish were very beautiful, and so after they were cast up on the beach professional collectors and sellers would descend on the beach and swoop up all the shells to take them home where they would boil them and clean out all the flesh of the animals inside them and then sell the shells to tourists. Some of the shells were very valuable for they were very rare, and a lot of money could be made by a diligent collector.



One morning, after the moon and the wind had been just right, and many shellfish had been tossed up on the beach, a man was seen at the far end of the beach all by himself, picking up starfish one by one and throwing them back into the sea.

Curious about what he was doing with the starfish while so many other people were busy collecting the shellfish someone went over to him and asked him if he too collected things on the beach. He was asked how what he was doing could make a difference in the face of all the collecting going on. As he threw another starfish back into the sea he turned and said, "It made a difference to that one."

KLT EARNS NATIONAL ACCREDITATION STATUS

The Land Trust Accreditation Commission, a program that promotes national quality standards for ensuring permanence in the conservation of American lands, announced that more than 400 land trusts have now earned the national accreditation mark of distinction. This new total came as thirty-nine land trusts, including the Kennebec Land Trust (KLT), were recognized for having completed the rigorous process required to achieve first-time or renewed accreditation.

KLT provided extensive documentation to the Accreditation Commission and was subject to a comprehensive third-party evaluation prior to achieving this distinction. In awarding accreditation, the Commission signified its confidence that KLT's lands will be protected forever. Accredited land trusts like KLT steward almost 20 million acres of land – comparable to the entire State of Maine.

KLT incoming board president Kim Vandermeulen, chair of KLT's accreditation committee, worked on the application requirements with current president Mary Denison, director Bob Marvinney, and staff members Theresa Kerchner and Jean-Luc Theriault, with the support of accreditation volunteers Jane Davis and Donna Buck. Upon receiving notification of the Commission's decision, Mary Denison noted:

Receiving LTA Accreditation is huge achievement and we are very proud to be able to display the accreditation seal, which confirms that the Kennebec Land Trust is conducting business at the highest possible standard. The seal also underscores our continued commitment to honor the intent of our land donors, while providing public access to beautiful woodlands, lakes, and streams. We are pleased that we have been nationally recognized as a well-managed land trust that residents of Maine can rely on to be responsible stewards of conservation land for years to come.

SUSTAIN WAYNE



Sustain Wayne's efforts to secure and renovate the old Hall on the Mill Pond got a great boost this spring when we were awarded a Community

Development Block Grant (CBDG) through the State of Maine Office of Community and Economic Development. The \$50,000 award will be allocated toward façade work, including clapboard repair and exterior painting, window restoration/repair, roof repair, and limited foundation work.

Our current fundraising effort for the Hall is focused on completing Phase One of the project: primarily assuring the structural integrity of the building and foundation. Recent efforts by Dirigo Architectural Engineering confirmed what the Sustain Wayne building committee had previously determined: the Hall is in relatively good shape given its age and recent neglect.

However, the study did convey an unexpected urgency in replacing the sill on the East side of the building. Years of fighting snowmelt and erosion have resulted in significant rot. The first phase of our renovation plan includes jacking the building several feet, bringing it out of the floodplain, replacing the sill and failing footings, and constructing a new foundation.

Once the structural work is completed, we will use the CBDG grant funds to complete the façade work. Getting the building back on a solid footing, which will allow for public entry and limited use, will be a big step toward our longer-term vision for the building.

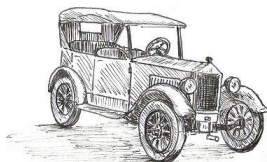

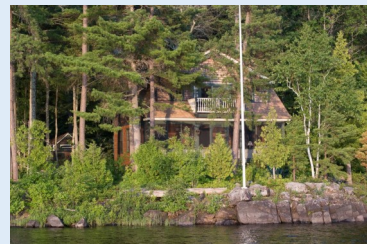

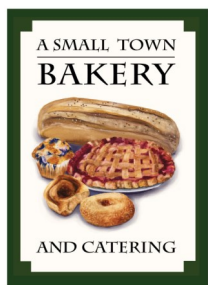
