This month the **Selectboard** will be meeting on **August** 6 and **August 20** at 6:30 PM at the **Wayne Town Office**.

This month the **Planning Board** will be meeting on **Wednesday, August 7**<sup>th</sup> at **7:00 PM** at the **Wayne Town Office.** 

The Town's **Assessor Agent** Rob Duplisea from RJD Appraisal will be available by appointment on **Monday, August 26, 2019** to answer any questions you might have about your assessment or tax bill. Please contact the Town Office to schedule an appointment.

In observation of **Labor Day**, **Monday**, **September 2, 2019**, the Town Office will be closed. It will re-open on Tuesday September 3, 2019, during our regularly scheduled hours.

Your **2019 property taxes** were committed in July and tax bills will be mailed at the end of August. **Property taxes are due on Tuesday, October 1st, 2019.** 

Several years ago, the Town adopted a **Consumer Fireworks ban**. Please respect this ban for everyone's safety and peaceful enjoyment of town. The Town will enforce this ban.

Please be courteous of your neighbors and drive responsibly. The Town has contracted with Kennebec County Sheriff's Office for rural patrol this summer. Police will take notice.

The Town has adopted a non-smoking policy for all Town properties. Please be considerate of others.

The Town has hired a new **Code Enforcement Officer & Local Plumbing Inspector**, his name is **Paul Mitnik**, he can be reached at (207) 313-2648. His office hours are Thursday and Friday from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM at the Town Office.

The Town has hired a new **Animal Control Officer (ACO),** her name is **Anna Carll,** she can be reached at (207) 622-6404. Taylor Stevenson will continue on to be our back-up ACO.

The Town of Wayne has an Animal Control Ordinance that states no domesticated animal, licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted on Town property (highways, sidewalks, Ladd Recreation Center, parks, footbridge, Wayne Town House, North Wayne School House, Town Boat Launch, Fire Stations, or old Town Office) **without a leash**. The Town provides dog waste bags in the parks around the mill pond, please be courteous of others who use these public facilities and **pickup after your dogs**.



#### Fall Prevention Thoughts from AAH

Think about your fear of falling; what do you fear? How can you improve your movements and decrease your fear? When you avoid walking because you fear you might fall, you don't do the movements you need to help improve your balance. This may lead to MORE falls. Here are ways to improve:

Check your house for and remove tripping hazards, such as scatter rugs, clutter, and obstacles to your easy movement in the home.

Make sure your home and stairs are well lighted.

Wear sensible shoes.

Get out and walk frequently. Use a cane, use a walker, hold the arm of a friend, but walk!

Have your vision checked and wear the glasses prescribed by your eye doctor.

Check with your PCP to see if your medications may make you more prone to falls.

Join a Tai Chi class, take Yoga, or go to a Physical Therapist. These have proved to be key in fall prevention.

Movement improves your balance AND your overall health.


