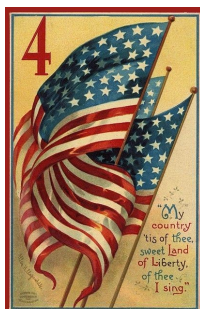
This month the **Planning Board** will NOT be meeting in **July 2019**. Their next scheduled meeting will be on Wednesday August 7.

This month the Board of Selectmen will be meeting on **Tuesday July 9 and July 23 at 6:30 PM** at the Wayne Elementary School Town Office.

The Town’s **Assessor Agent** Rob Duplisea from RJD Appraisal will be available by appointment on **Monday July 22, 2019** between 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM to answer any questions you might have about your assessment or tax bill. Please contact, the Town Office to schedule an appointment.

Please be courteous of your neighbors and drive responsibly. The Town has contracted with Kennebec County Sheriff’s Office for rural patrol this summer. Police will take notice.

The Town of Wayne has an Animal Control Ordinance that states no domesticated animal, licensed or unlicensed, shall be permitted on Town property (highways, sidewalks, Ladd Recreation Center, parks, footbridge, Wayne Town House, North Wayne School House, Town Boat Launch, Fire Stations, or old Town Office) **without a leash**. Wayne Historical Society Presents

"Wayne, Maine: The Postcard View" at the Cary Memorial Library on July 14, 3PM

Kevin Johnson, photo archivist for the Penobscot Marine Museum in Searsport, Maine will present "Wayne, Maine: The Postcard View; Selections from the Eastern Illustrating & Publishing Company". The slide show and talk will consist of the story of the postcard company as well as historical views of Wayne and neighboring towns.

The Eastern Illustrating & Publishing Company was founded in 1909 in Belfast, Maine by Rudolph Herman Cassens. Cassens' goal was to photograph small towns and rural areas from Maine to California, producing "real photo" postcards that would be valued for promoting tourism. His company produced over 50,000 glass plate negatives of New England and Upstate New York between 1909 and 1947. The collection is full of historic businesses, family homes and local landmarks.

The images are fascinating on many levels. They take viewers back in time to when the roads were still dirt, horse drawn carriages outnumbered cars, coastlines were undeveloped, and elms lined the streets. The collection is now part of the archives of the Penobscot Marine Museum and continues to grow as more negatives that "escaped" from the collection are located and acquired. The Kennebec Land Trust is excited to announce our newest project—purchasing and permanently conserving 330 acres in Fayette, including the top of 600-foot Surry Hill. This extensive property features over 250 acres of forestland, streams flowing into our local lakes and ponds, valuable wetlands, and phenomenal scenic views.

This new community conservation property will provide many recreational opportunities, including hiking, snowmobiling, hunting, mountain biking, and nature observation.

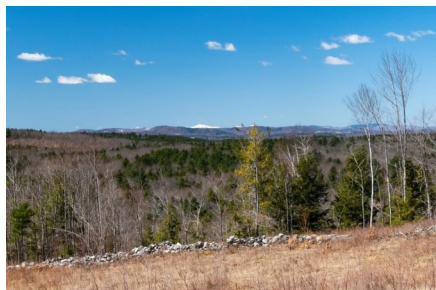
