INTERESTING WAYNE HISTORY FROM THE WAYNE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Lee Williams was a student at Princeton University and a member of the United Federalists, a precursor to the United Nations, when this picture was taken. Lee Williams and Albert Einstein, who it is believed was a professor at Princeton at the time, were likely discussing the United Federalists organization. Lee Williams, who became a CIA agent for 36 years, was married to Eileen Honor O'Rourke and they once owned the Williams Property house which is now owned by the Cary Memorial Library.

Lee was born and grew up in Dalton, Massachusetts. He was a descendant of the famous Puritan Jonathan Edwards, author of the Great Awakening and missionary to the Mahicans. He was from the famous clan of Williamses-ministers, missionaries, pioneers and educators who reformed the Congregational Church and founded Williams College. He was also a collateral descendant and namesake of the Eleazer Williams who was captured and carried off to Canada in the Deerfield raid of 1704, and was later believed by some to be the lost dauphin of France. One of Lee's favorite stories concerned registration day at Princeton. On seeing his name, the man handling his papers cried, "Ah Vous e tres le dauphin perdu!" It made Lee's day if not his whole four years.

Lee was decorated for heroism during the Battle of the Bulge. He was an infantry scout at age 20, and was wounded so badly he spent 5 months in the hospital recovering.

He eventually went on to marry Eileen Honor O'Rourke of Brooklyn, New York and Wayne, Maine.

There was a stint at Harvard Law School and he eventually retired from, after a long and distinguished career as a foreign service officer specializing in matters of intelligence.

Lee was a senior officer in the Central Intelligence Agency in its greatest days. After a time in Vietnam he was involved in the Paris Peace talks where he lived in a houseboat on the Seine

under the Eiffel tower. My sister Maggie often functioned as his hostess for gatherings he had there (grand piano and all), when my Aunt Honor was here in Wayne with their son in summers.

Lee was the best person to sit beside at a gathering; always humorous, a phenomenal baritone, and an athlete. He was a great linguist when he admitted to understanding the language. Family stories go on and on.
