Extra! Extra! Read all about it!

From Saturday, February 23 – Tuesday, February 26, more than 900 United Methodist delegates, from around the world, will be convening in St. Louis, Missouri. And they may be charting a whole new course for the denomination!

The purpose of the meeting will be to act on a report issued by "The Commission on a Way Forward". The 32-member Commission was appointed by the Council of Bishops in 2016. Their task was to re-examine paragraphs in The Book of Discipline which pertain to human sexuality, and to relate the content to the rights of gay, lesbian, and bisexual persons who wish to be considered for ordination. Furthermore, the Commission was to respond to the request for same-sex marriages being performed within the Church.

The majority of Bishops have endorsed one of these four proposals:

The One Church Plan: This plan would allow for regional differences: allowing annual conferences, congregations, and individuals to believe and to practice according to the ways they felt that God was leading them.

The (Modified) Traditionalist Plan: This plan would codify the current official teachings (i.e. no gay ordinations/ no same-sex

marriages), and would require the withdrawal from annual conferences, of those pastors and congregations who did not pledge to uphold this same stance.

The Connectional Conference Plan: This plan would divide the denomination into two or more bodies, according to their theological convictions. They would relate to each other as being historically-connected, but their actions would be determined independently.

The Simple Plan: This plan would simply remove all restrictive language about LGBTQ persons from the Book of Discipline, and we would continue as we have done previously.

Stay tuned for next month's "Messenger" to see what unfolds!

HOW TO OBSERVE THE FORTY DAYS OF LENT

For starters, each participant will be given a listing of “40 Activities to Do during Lent”.

*At the end of EACH DAY, everyone is being asked to empty his or her wallet/purse of all change accumulated – and to bring it to church on Sunday. This will go into our “Make a Change” jug – all proceeds of which will go toward paying our Mission Apportionments!

Those who would like to covenant with each other – to do daily activities of one’s choice – are invited to brief weekly ‘check-ins’ in the Pastor’s Office (after the Sunday morning service).

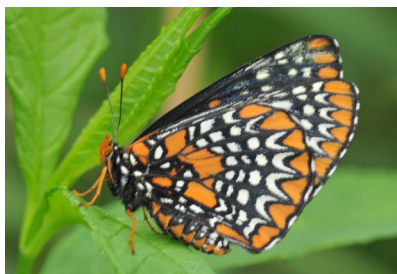

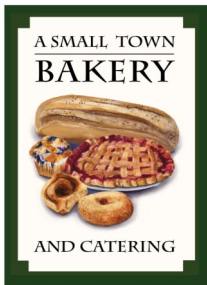

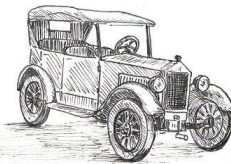
