In the March issue of The Messenger, I outlined the reason for the Special General Conference of the United Methodist Church to convene - which was to respond to the request that same-sex marriages be allowed within the context of a religious ceremony, and also to authorize the ordination of gay, lesbian or bisexual persons.

As it happened, many of us clergy, were stunned by the outcome: that both the rules against the ordination of gay individuals and against officiating at same-gender unions were actually strengthened – including penalties for the pastors who defied them.

IF this plan is, in fact, implemented, the decision to exclude LGBTQIA members from full participation in the life of the church may well result in a historic schism (such as occurred in 1844 over the issue of slavery). Nothing will happen 'overnight' – but in the meantime, we are standing strong in our stance of inclusivity.

The congregation of The Wayne Community Church submits the following statement:

"Everyone is welcome at the Wayne Community Church. We invite ANY one desiring to grow closer

to God through Jesus Christ to participate in the life of the church. We welcome people of any age, race, ethnicity, immigration, marital or economic status, gender identity or sexual orientation, family structure, physical or mental ability, political and religious background. We are all children of God."

So be it!

# AGING AT HOME NEWS MAY 2019

Coffee and Conversation, sponsored by the Ladd Center and AAH is over for this season. See you again in the late fall!

Our last Senior Luncheon until the fall will be Wednesday, May 8 at 12 Noon at the Cary Memorial Library. This event is free and open to everyone.

Tai Chi will have it's last Friday "play" at the Ladd Center on May 31st. You should continue doing Tai Chi on your own until we start again in the fall.

Aging At Home has applied for a grant from AARP to provide a number of safety features to Wayne residents. The first feature is: highly reflective address numerals for your house or mailbox. These numbers should help ensure that in an emergency your house can be found by fire or rescue personnel. As John Dovinsky, chief of ambulance service in Winthrop says, "In a life-threatening emergency, time is of the essence. If a house is not clearly identified, that may lead to a delay in treating the person."

Two other safety features are: stickers to place on a window or door of your home indicating to emergency personnel that a child, an elder, or a hard-of-hearing person is living within. Also, the "file of life" red magnetic envelopes which will stick to your refrigerator. You can keep your current medical information in them. In an emergency, the information will be readily available to those concerned.

We are hoping for funding for these 3 safety features from the grant.

The goal of Aging At Home is to help keep elders in their homes for as long as possible as they age.




